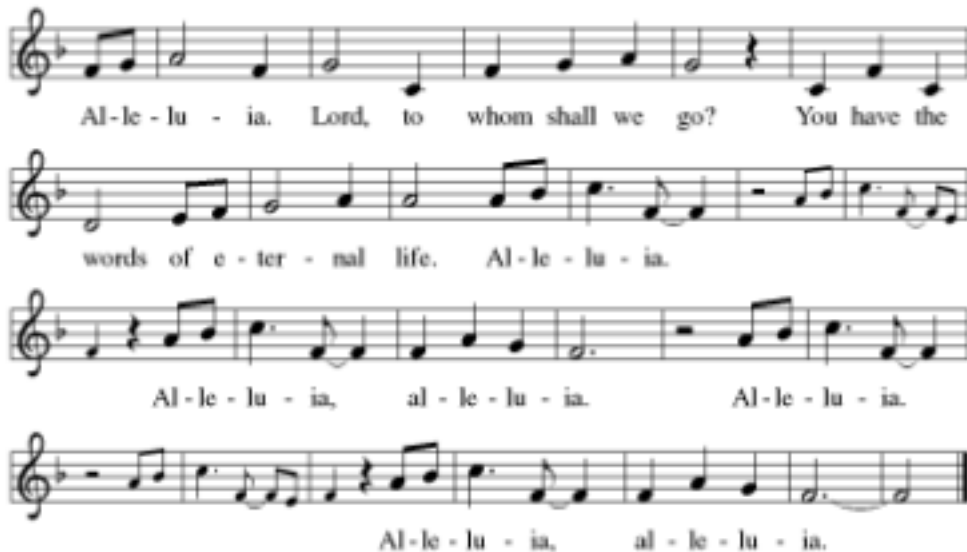

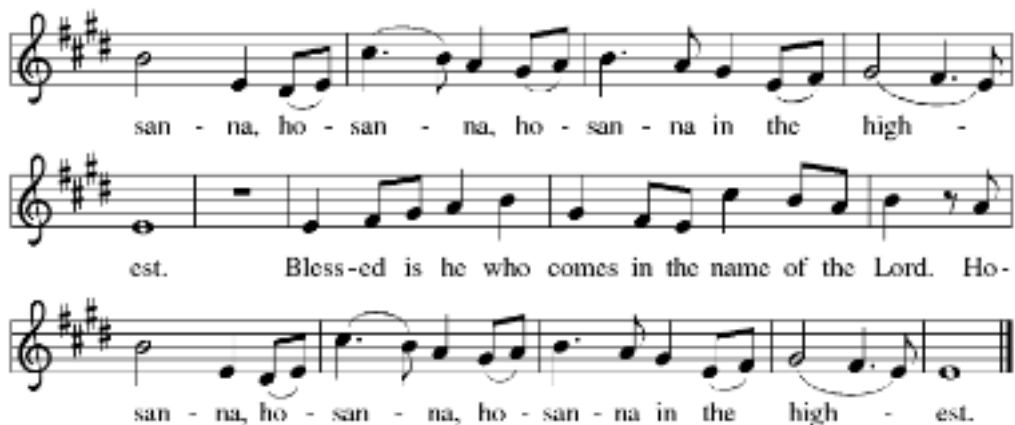

THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Worshipers who are not yet communing are invited to come forward for a blessing.

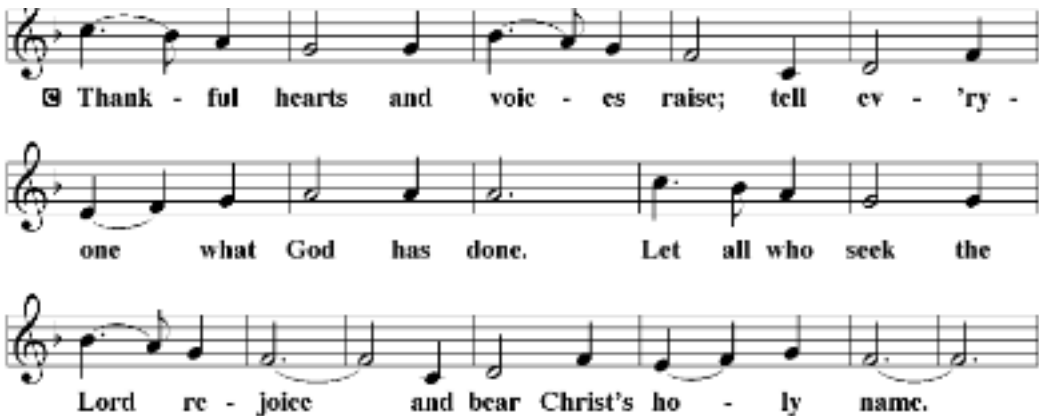
